

### Articles analyze opportunities and risks related to youth

Currently, Brazil has about 50 million people aged 15 to 29 years, representing nearly 26% of the population. To examine who they are and what are their needs and wants, experts from the Instituto de Pesquisa Econômica Aplicada (Ipea), Secretaria de Assuntos Estratégicos da Presidência da República (SAE/PR), Research Center for International Development (IDRC, Canada)and the Centro de Estudios Distributivos Laborales y Sociales (Cedlas) da Universidade de La Plata, put together in articles, responses to some of the most relevant issues related to youth. Consequently, these will allow for more appropriate targeted public actions.
